LAURA K.M. DONORFIO, Ph.D. - Watertown High School, Class of 1984

After earning her doctorate in family studies with a concentration in aging, Dr. Donorfio was appointed by the MIT AgeLab as a Visiting Scientist for 10 years, conducting and publishing research on self-regulation of driving behavior in older adults. Educating students for over 20 years, Dr. Donorfio is an Associate Professor at the University of Connecticut, where she was chosen among all UConn faculties for the award of "Excellence in Teaching Promise." Dr. Donorfio also organizes yearly international teaching institutes and teacher education workshops.

CHRISTOPHER SABIS - Watertown High School, Class of 1996

After earning a BA magna cum laude and a Juris Doctor (JD) Degree, Mr. Sabis served as a law clerk for two District of Columbia judges and worked in private practice before becoming an Assistant United States Attorney in Nashville, Tennessee. Mr. Sabis also serves on the Board of STARS Nashville, a non-profit addressing bullying, substance abuse, violence, and other barriers to success in Tennessee schools. He has been an Adjunct Professor of Law, is an active contributor to several bar associations, and is a member of a number of community organizations.
